COURSE ABSTRACT

The main purpose of this course is to provide an overview of the EU primary and secondary legislation regulating the public procurement activities of the Member States and help students to understand the main principles governing the rights and obligations of Member States and their contracting authorities. The course will also provide a basic knowledge of the EU law in key aspects of procurement, such as the obligation of a tender, preparation of tender documentation, selection of candidates, tender procedures, contract awarding and recourse to potential remedies at national and EU level.

The course is based on the 2014 Public Procurement directives that will introduce significant changes to the existing public procurement rules and principles. The course consists of lectures and seminars. Lectures on a particular topic will be followed by one or more seminars. For seminars students will be expected to analyse and discuss real or fictional cases. The course includes also a study visit in order to offer students an opportunity to meet practitioners working in authorities responsible for monitoring transparency and legality of public procurement procedures.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

The primary objective of this course is to develop a solid comprehension of the main principles governing the award of public contracts in the EU, the applicable legal framework and the relevant case-law of the Court of Justice of the EU in the field of public procurement. Special emphasis will be placed on developing students' problem-solving and analytical skills.
