# **COURSE ABSTRACT**

The course is intended for speakers who use Latvian as native language, because the main goal of the course is to analyse and examine the problems related to codified norms of formal written Latvian standard variety. The aim of the course is to gain an insight into basic issues of Latvian standard language and to develop and consolidate the competence necessary for effective use of contemporary Latvian. The main focus is on such codified norms of standard as grammar rules, spelling and punctuation. To enhance standard language skills, the tasks of the course are based on a wide range of texts.

#### **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

The objectives of course are to:

- introduce students to a range of rules codified for standard variety of language,
- develop analytical skills to determine typical errors of standard language use,
- develop the skill to identify theoretical sources for different language rules,
- encourage ability to use effectively standard variety in a wide range of texts.
