### COURSE ABSTRACT

The course is aimed at introducing the students with instruments for approaching and understanding law. The participants of the course will explore the relationship between (different conceptions) of justice. They will be introduced to the basic ingredients of legal systems and will be provided with a set of techniques used to analyse and apply the law and to determine the appropriate weight that should be accorded to different sources of law. The students will be introduced to various branches of law and will learn about the different way law operates in those areas.

## **COURSE REQUIREMENTS**
