COURSE ABSTRACT

This course introduces students to contracting in the information technology field. We will adopt a practical approach to exploring the fundamentals of how contracts are concluded; issues in cross-border contracting; main types of ICT transactions (distribution, licensing and services agreements); smart contracts, Blockchain and AI in the ICT contract drafting; intellectual property in ICT contracting; data transfers, non-compete, non-solicitation and confidentiality clauses, inkless contracts, and contract drafting and negotiation, use of language (legal linguistics) in contracts.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

The course aims to equip lawyers and managers in the IT field with a framework for understanding, analysing and drafting effective contracts. Upon completing this course, students should have a good understanding of standard contractual language, the meaning of "magic words" in contracts, jurisdictional issues, and the specific ways in which contracts are concluded online and in person, including use of legal technologies in contract drafting.
