COURSE ABSTRACT

This course provides students with a comprehensive understanding of corporate law and corporate social responsibility (CSR). The first three sessions (12 hours) introduce the foundations of corporate law, including corporate structures, governance, and legal principles. The next two sessions (8 hours) focus on CSR theory, legal frameworks, and regulatory developments (including social enterprises and b-corps). The final session (4 hours) is dedicated to practical case studies of CSR implementation in various jurisdictions. During the course, an active participation of the students will be promoted and appropriately assessed.

GRADING CRITERIA

The final examination will consist in an in-class closed-book analysis of a fictitious corporate law-related case. The students will be asked to identify the players and the competences, and to focus on some specific profiles directly linked to the topics examined over the course.
